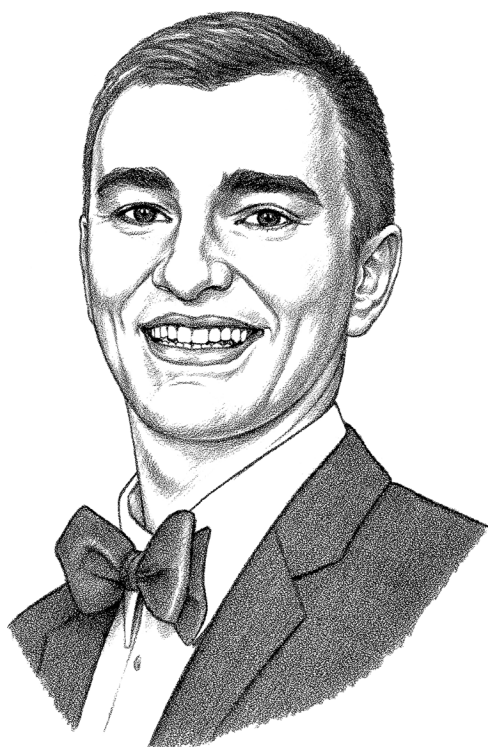

CHIP RANK

Athlete, Class of 2010



Chip Rank was one of the most highly decorated multi-sport athletes in the history of Cedarburg High School. He earned four varsity letters each in the sports of football and basketball. Chip began his basketball career as a freshman starter and led his team for two years as captain. Chip scored an impressive 1,527 career points, which was the boys' CHS career record at that time. Chip was 1st Team All-Conference as a sophomore, junior and senior. During his junior year, he earned All-State Honorable Mention and went on to receive 1st Team All-State his senior season. Chip capped off a dominant senior season averaging a double-double with 25 points and 10 rebounds. He holds the CHS record for most points scored in a game with 47 points. In addition to his many accomplishments, Chip was also known throughout CHS for his tremendous leadership qualities and work ethic.

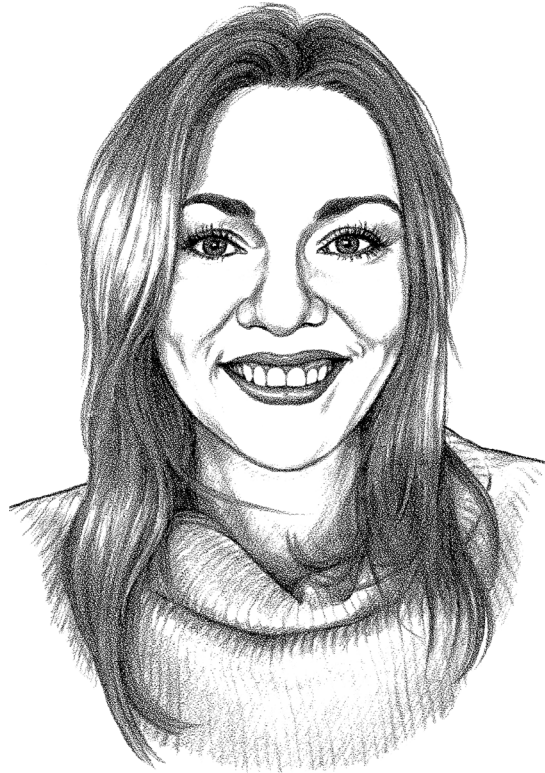
Chip was a multi-sport talent who also excelled in football. He started as quarterback for the varsity team for three years. He was a team captain during his junior and senior years. As the starting quarterback, Chip led the team to qualify for three straight WIAA playoffs. He finished his career with 2,883 passing yards and 28 touchdowns. As a junior, Chip was named All-Conference Honorable Mention. This was followed by the award of 2nd Team All-Conference his senior year. Chip's outstanding play earned the attention of many colleges around the country.

After his outstanding high school career, Chip earned a basketball scholarship at the University of Northern Iowa. While at UNI, he tied for third in all-time games played with 135. Chip finished his basketball career at UNI in the top 100 in career points with a total of 592. He was also a three-time Missouri Valley Conference Scholar-Athlete.

KAREN SUEPPEL

Standout athlete Karen Sueppel was a four-year varsity volleyball star for Cedarburg High School during the 2005-2008 seasons. Despite missing half of her freshman season due to injury, she was still awarded All-Conference Honorable Mention. Karen's success continued into her sophomore year as she recorded 307 kills which were the second best in school history. Karen's stellar performance on the court also helped her team to win the Conference Championship. She capped off her 2006 season earning 1st Team All-Conference and All-State Honorable Mention.

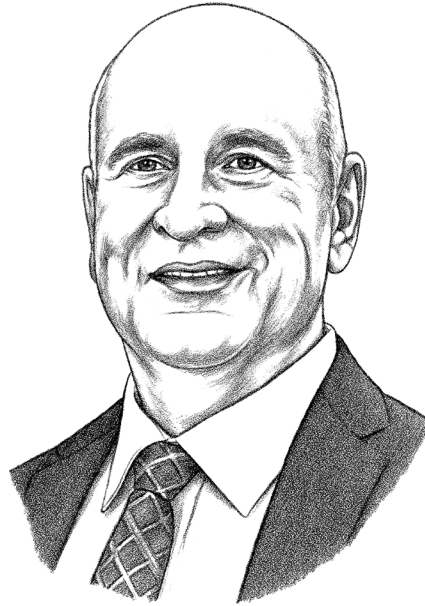
In 2007 as a junior, Karen set the single-season kill record with a total of 566, averaging 5.72 kills per set, creating a new school record. These accomplishments also helped Karen to earn the North Shore Conference Player of the Year, as well as Second-team All-State. During her senior year, she added another 504 kills setting another school record. Karen was voted 1st Team All-Conference and was selected to the coveted 1st Team All-State. She ended her career at Cedarburg with a record of 1,478 spike kills.

After completing her outstanding career at CHS, Karen played volleyball in college at Loyola University Chicago for two years. After her second year, she decided to focus on her studies at UW-Eau Claire earning a degree in social work. A longtime passion and love for volleyball led Karen to start the first women's volleyball club at UW-Eau Claire. She played and coached two back-to-back Wisconsin Volleyball Conference Championships. After a notable volleyball career, Karen was inducted into the 2020 Wisconsin Volleyball Conference Hall of Fame.

Distinguished Service



The definition of service can mean many things as shown through the acts, contributions, and generosity of Hall of Fame Inductee, Rick Buser. Rick was a 1979 graduate of Cedarburg High School. While attending CHS, he was a three-sport varsity athlete that participated on the football, basketball, and tennis teams. Upon graduation, Rick went on to continue his education at MSOE.

Rick is someone who really embraces the entrepreneurial spirit by owning, operating, and selling numerous successful bars and pubs in the community and surrounding areas. One of Rick's signature bars, that many in our community have frequented, is Maxwell's located right down the street from where he graduated.

A long-time philanthropist, Rick has made charitable donations to several organizations for the betterment of all students. His generosity has been directed not just to his alma mater, but to other local organizations as well, including various elementary schools. Additionally, Rick's leadership was key to the completion of the turf project that benefits our community, students, and athletes. Rick has also been a long-time supporter of the annual Bulldog Classic golf outing which is the main athletics fundraiser each year at CHS. Rick does this outstanding work with little to no fanfare which is a testament to his character.

Along with being a great community member, Rick has also been a prominent sponsor and supporter of many high school feeder programs including the Cedarburg Mercs, Ozaukee Hockey Teams, Cedarburg Select Baseball, Cedarburg Basketball Club, Cedarburg Dawgs, and the Cedarburg Crush. Rick is best known for his trademark words of "tell me what you need."

With respect to all of Rick's donations and charitable work, he never lost sight of his main goal which was to support our youth and to give back to younger generations. Over the years, Rick has facilitated or participated in raising approximately \$10,000 to \$25,000 a year for over 35 years. In addition, Rick has helped coordinate the volunteer efforts of hundreds of people, dedicating in excess of 10,000 hours to help students in our community.
