ATHLETE CLASS OF 2013



Josee Stiever was unequivocally one of the best athletes to play at Cedarburg High School. She specifically excelled in soccer. Attending CHS from 2009-2013, she started all soccer games in her high school career and was also the starting Varsity Basketball point guard her freshman and sophomore years.

With her incredible talents, Josee earned the Wisconsin Gatorade Player of the Year in back to back years, 2011-12, and her senior year, 2012-13. She was named to the NSCAA Girls High School All-America Team in 2012 and 2013, Wisconsin Soccer Coaches Association Player of the Year in 2012, and Milwaukee Journal Sentinel Area Player of the Year in 2013.

She was team MVP during the 2010 and 2011 seasons. During this time, she led the team in goals and assists. Josee received First Team All-State accolades in 2011, 2012, and 2013, helping to lead her team to a WIAA State Championship in 2013. Josee's positive attitude, work ethic, and competitive spirit had a profound impact on the CHS Soccer Program. In her spare time, Josee participated in Student Council, French Club, National Honor Society and was a scholar athlete. She volunteered in her local church by helping serve meals to the homeless and with Portal Prom.

After high school, Josee went on to play college soccer at the University of Minnesota. During her time there, she played in 86 games, garnering 21 goals and 20 assists. Josee was named to the Big Ten All-Freshman Team as well as the NSCAA All-Great Lakes Region Second Team (2015) and First Team (2016). She was twice named the team's Most Valuable Offensive Player and, to end her college career in 2016, received All-Big Ten First Team and Academic All-District honors. She continued her soccer career by playing with the United States U-23 Women's National Team in 2016.

LOGAN LAUTERS

ATHLETE CLASS OF 2011



Logan Lauters was one of the most accomplished football players in the state, area, conference, and Cedarburg High School history. During his time at CHS from 2007-2011, he set many records at Cedarburg High School and in the state of Wisconsin. A four year letter winner on both the football and track teams, he was the football team captain when they headed to the WIAA Division 2 State Championship Game.

While at CHS, Logan had an outstanding football career. He was First Team All-North Shore Conference running back three years in a row from 2008-10. In 2009 and 2010, Logan earned North Shore Conference Player of the Year and WFCA All-Region. During Logan's senior year in 2010, he was Associated Press First Team All-State, Milwaukee Journal Sentinel First Team All-State, and WFCA All-State while leading the team to a state runner-up finish.

Logan's high school accomplishments were a direct result of his dedication and work ethic. He rushed for 5,851 yards, 80 career rushing touchdowns, and 83 total touchdowns, all of which are still records today. During Logan's senior year, he played in 14 games while earning single season records in rushing yards, with 2,655 yards, and rushing touchdowns, with 33. Logan's impressive statistics were not overshadowed by his team first mentality. He ended his high school career as the third all-time leader in career rushing yards in Wisconsin high school history as well as third all-time in single season rushing yards in the state.

After graduating from Cedarburg High School, Logan went on to play at the University of Minnesota-Duluth. During his time there, he was a three year letter winner and received Second Team All-Conference honors in 2015. At the end of his collegiate career, Logan accumulated 2,648 rushing yards and 27 rushing touchdowns.

JACK FRIESS

COACH 1979-2019



Jack Friess was a humble, smart coach during his 41 years as the head Varsity Baseball Coach. From 1979 to 2019 he led teams to an astounding 600 wins, including eight seasons with more than 20 wins. Over Coach Friess' tenure, his teams secured three North Shore Conference championships, six second place finishes in the conference, and six state tournament appearances. CHS finished as the WIAA state runner-up in both 1997 and 1998. While Coach Friess was head coach, many of his players would go on to play college baseball.

In 1999, he was elected to the State of Wisconsin Baseball Coaches Hall of Fame. In 2012, alongside Jim Gantner, Coach Friess was enshrined in the Wisconsin Old Timers Hall of Fame. Coach Friess was the first ever recipient of the Ethics in Coaching Award from the Wisconsin Baseball Coaches Association (WBCA) in 2014. The current baseball facility, which was named after Coach Friess in 2014, is Jack Friess Field. In 2021, Coach Friess was the recipient of the WBCA Distinguished Service Award, a tribute to his lifelong passion for the game.

Coach Friess was chairman of the WBCA Summer All-State committee for over 20 years, a clinic speaker, and coached in the 1992 WBCA All-Star Classic. He was also the 1998 District VI Coach of the Year. Active in the community as well, Coach Friess organized and conducted winter pitcher-catcher clinics and coaching clinics for Cedarburg youth baseball for more than 30 years.

Coach Friess grew up in Cedarburg, attending CHS from 1963-1967. He was inducted as an athlete into the Hall of Fame in 2012. He earned all-conference honors at the University of Wisconsin-Oshkosh as a center fielder while leading his team to the 1971 College World Series. In 1971, he was drafted by the Chicago White Sox. He taught physical education at Webster Middle School for 34 years.

DR. DARYL HERRICK

DISTINGUISHED SERVICE



Dr. Daryl Herrick had an incredible impact on the Cedarburg School District over his 13 years as superintendent. Specific to athletics, he helped create the Athletic Hall of Fame and Cedarburg Basketball Club. In addition, under Dr. Herrick's leadership, CHS developed some of the best athletic facilities in the state.

With a few key community members, Dr. Herrick initiated the creation of the Cedarburg Basketball Club (CBC) in 2002. Still going strong more than twenty years later, the CBC is instrumental in the development of middle school students' skills in a competitive environment. Dr. Herrick also initiated the Athletic Hall of Fame for Cedarburg High School. With the first honorees inducted in 2011, this has contributed to the outstanding history within CHS and the community, and it is only appropriate that Dr. Herrick is now a part of this legacy as an inductee, himself.

Most importantly, we can thank Dr. Herrick for the many athletic facilities developed or expanded during his tenure, including: varsity and junior varsity softball fields, junior varsity tennis courts, new irrigation systems underneath six practice fields and game fields, and a new football stadium and track. In 2001, he recommended the expansion to build a fieldhouse, now the most used facility in the community. In the later part of his time as superintendent, he proposed the construction of the baseball concession stand as well as a soccer and softball concession stand with bathrooms in 2009-10. During the 2011-12 school year, he supported renovation of the varsity and junior varsity baseball complex with dugouts, press box, and bleachers.

The scope of Dr. Herrick's reach extends far beyond CHS Athletics to many academic successes such as adding 32 new courses, repeated national recognition for quality education, and consistent high ACT scores. He was also a driving force in the creation of the Cedarburg Education Foundation and enhanced technology throughout the district. We are deeply appreciative of Dr. Herrick's dedication and passion for his service to CHS and the Cedarburg community.
