Early College Credit Program (ECCP) & Start College Now (SCN) Annual Notification

Dear Parents, Guardians, & Students,

The Early College Credit Program (ECCP) allows all high school students who meet certain requirements to take one or more courses at an institution of higher education for high school and/or college credit. Under ECCP, "Institution of higher education" means an institution within the University of Wisconsin system, a tribally-controlled college, or a private, nonprofit institution of higher education within Wisconsin.

The Start College Now (SCN) Program allows students who have completed 10th grade and meet certain requirements to take one or more courses at a Wisconsin technical college for high school and/or college credit.

High school students apply for ECCP by completing an application prior to <u>October 1</u> for spring semester classes, <u>February 1</u> for summer classes, or <u>March 1</u> for fall classes. Students apply for SCN by completing an application prior to <u>October 1</u> for spring semester classes and <u>March 1</u> for fall classes. Applications can be picked up and returned to the Counseling Office.

While these programs are for current high school students, state law requires that districts provide information about these two programs to all students in grades 8 - 11 by October 1 each year. Cedarburg School District has two policies addressing ECCP and SCN: <u>Board Policy 2271</u> - Early College Credit Program and <u>Board Policy 2271.01</u> - Start College Now.
