ANDY FRIESS

Athlete, Class of 1992



Andy Friess, a 4-sport letter winner, earned a total of 13 letters between 1989 and 1992: 3 in football, 3 in track, 3 in basketball, and 4 in baseball. Andy's main sport was baseball. Andy, the team's catcher, was honored as Offensive MVP in 1989, 1990, 1991, and 1992, and served as Team Captain in 1990, 1991, and 1992. Additional honors include First-Team All-Conference Catcher in 1990, 1991, and 1992; All-District First Team in 1992; and All-State Player Second Team in 1992.

Andy's impressive statistics during his 4-year CHS baseball career include the following: Hits (136), RBI (97), Doubles (28, third in school history), Triples (8, tied for first in school history), HR (11, second in school history), Total Bases (213), BB (104), Hit Safely (80 games, second in school history), Put outs by Catcher (579), Assists (100), Games Played (116, second in school history), OB Percentage (.559), Slugging Percentage (.632), Fielding Average (.963), and Batting Average (.403).

After high school, Andy received a 4-year baseball scholarship to St. Xavier University in Chicago. After college, Andy played with the Green Bay Sultans-Independent Pro League.

JESSIE JOHNSON

Athlete, Class of 1993



Jessie Johnson, more than twenty years after graduation, continues to hold more than half of CHS's offensive records in softball. Jessie's records include most runs in a season (51), most hits in a season (42), and most homeruns in a season (8). Her career records include 141 runs, 132 hits, 93 RBI's, 89 stolen bases, and a .471 batting average.

Coach Rod Wilterdink ranks Jessie, a four-year letter winner and 1992 North Shore Player of the Year, as the best offensive player of his 26-year career. Wilterdink notes that Jessie sacrificed a promising high school career as an infielder to serve as the team's pitcher. Though inexperienced in this position, Jessie helped the team earn 37 victories in her four year career, including 8 no-hitters, and helped lead the Bulldogs to the WIAA State tournament three out of four years. Earning First Team All-Conference honors junior and senior year, Jessie was also Honorable Mention All-State as a junior and Third Team All-State as a senior.

After graduating from Cedarburg, Jessie became an All-American Second Baseman at UW Parkside, where she repeatedly participated in the NCAA Final Six, won numerous individual records, and ranked among the top in the nation in various categories. In 1994 and 1996, Jessie was an NCAA Division II All-American. She was named to the NCAA All-Central Region Team in 1994 and to the GLVC All-Conference Team in 1996 and 1997. Jessie, a 4-time Academic All-American, was inducted into the UW-Parkside Hall of Fame in 2012.

SHANE SCHMIDT

Athlete, Class of 1990



In his soccer career, Shane Schmidt has represented Cedarburg High School, the University of Evansville, and the United States. In 1990, Shane, as Captain, led his team to a WIAA State Championship. Individual honors in high school include the following: All-County 1987, 1988, and 1989, All-County Player of the Year in 1989, All-Conference Second Team in 1987, All-Conference First Team in 1988 and 1989, All-State in 1988 and 1989, and All-American in 1989.

Shane's success continued at the University of Evansville where he was Conference Freshman of the Year and Freshman All-American in 1990, the same year Shane's team played in the Final Four. Other University honors include being named All-Conference in 1990, 1991, 1992, and 1993, and All-Mideast Region in 1991, 1992, and 1993.

Shane also represented the US by being named to the U-20 National Team and the U-23 National Pool. Shane attended the US Olympic Festival in 1990 and 1991, winning the gold medal in 1991.

Professionally, Shane played for the Lexington Bluegrass Bandits in 1994 before moving on to the Milwaukee Wave for the 1994-95 and 1995-96 seasons. Shane then played for the Indiana Blast in 1997 and 1998.

Currently Shane teaches at Carmel High School in Carmel, Indiana, where he has been the Head Boys Varsity Coach since 2007 of nationally ranked Carmel High School.
