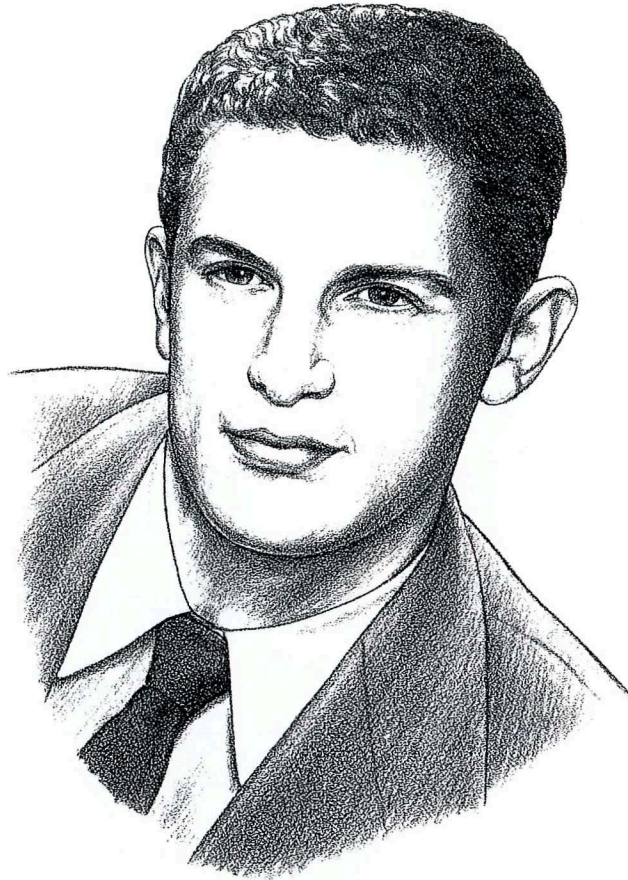

TED KENT

Athlete, Class of 1956



Ted Kent attended Cedarburg High School from 1952-1956, participating in three sports. Kent lettered in basketball three times, football twice, and track and field twice. He also served as team Captain for the basketball team. Averaging 19.2 points per game, Kent was selected to the 1956-57 First Team All-Conference Basketball Team and was selected for the Conference All-Star Team in the same year. He was also voted team MVP by his teammates and broke the most points scored in a game with 38, a record that stood for 14 years. Kent led the Bulldogs to a shared Braveland Conference Championship. He finished his basketball career holding the record for most steals with 72.

Kent also played defensive end, punted, and kicked extra points for the Bulldog Football Team. He broke the single game record for most points in one game with 16. Kent was elected to First-Team All-Conference in football. He was also Co-Captain of the Track and Field Team, setting the school record in pole vault at 11 feet. Kent won the Braveland Conference and Sectional competition before finishing in 4th place at State.

Kent received a basketball scholarship to attend Valparaiso University after his time as a Bulldog. He was on the first-string Freshman Basketball Team until a serious knee injury ended his time in college athletics. Kent later went on to attend the University of Wisconsin and graduated with a Business of Science degree in Economics. Kent has since opened Kent's Marketing, attributing his time as a Cedarburg Bulldog for building the determination, forthrightness and sincerity that helped him become a successful business owner.

MEGHAN HERRICK

Athlete, Class of 2008



Meghan Herrick attended Cedarburg High School from 2004-2008, participating in three sports. Herrick lettered in basketball, softball and volleyball; however, she attained most of her achievements in basketball. Herrick was a four-year letter winner in basketball. She received All-Conference Honorable Mention as a freshman point guard and earned First Team All-Conference and All-State Honorable mention as a senior. Herrick also led the team in scoring, assists, and rebounds as a senior. Herrick was elected team Captain in three out of four years as a member of the basketball program. She helped lead her team to three Conference Championships and captured a Regional Championship as a freshman. Herrick finished her career with the most wins in the history of Cedarburg girls' basketball.

Herrick competed in two other sports as a Bulldog, starting two years on the softball team and a year on the volleyball team. She was named First Team All-Conference shortstop as a freshman and senior. Herrick was selected to play in the Division 1 State Softball All-Star game, while also being selected as team Captain her senior year. In addition, she started on the Varsity Volleyball Team as a sophomore. Along with being a fantastic athlete, Herrick was exceptional in the classroom, finishing her academic career in the top two percent of her class.

Herrick attended the University of Chicago, was named an All-American for the 2010-11 basketball season, and was the team MVP in the same season. She broke multiple records, including 375 made free throws throughout her career and 146 free throws made in a season (2010-11). She also finished 10th all-time on the scoring list with 1,064 points and 7th all-time with 284 assists. Meghan helped lead her team to two University Athletic Association Conference Championships and three NCAA tournament bids.

PAT MOORE

Distinguished Service



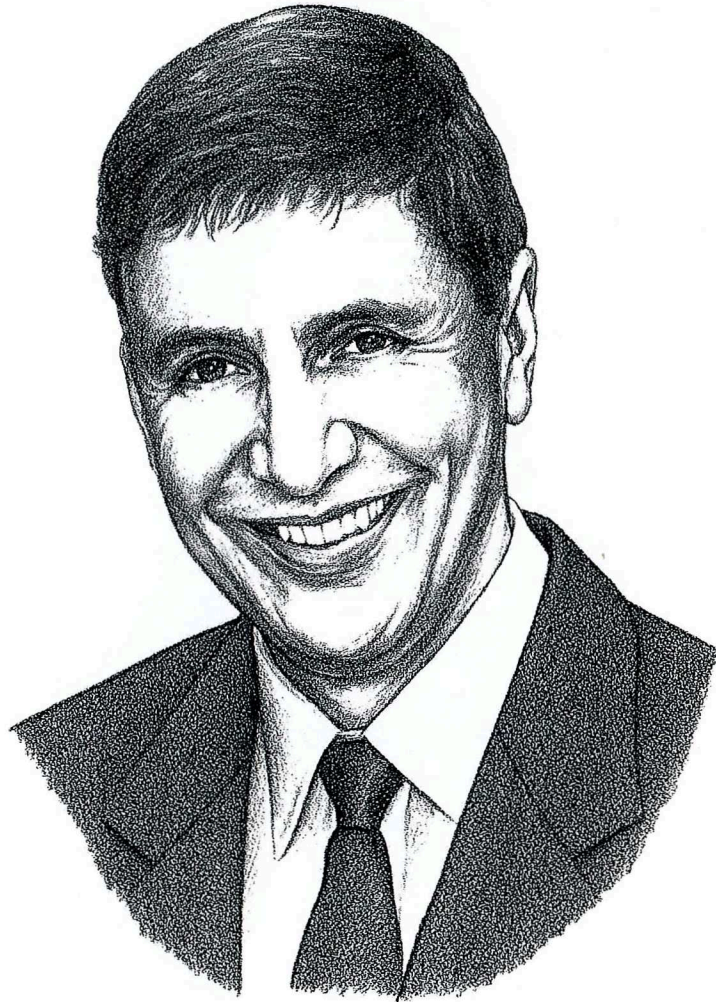
Pat Moore attended Cedarburg High School from 1974-1978 and is a four-sport varsity letter athlete who has continued to support Bulldog athletics throughout his adult life. His greatest athletic contribution includes his time as President and Coach of the Cedarburg Colts Youth Program from 1985-2011. Under Moore's leadership, the Colts Youth Program was instrumental in the development and support of the high school football program. His time coaching recreational, tournament and summer league basketball from grades 5 through 12 for 10 years has also been important in the development of young athletes in the community.

Moore served as Booster Club President (CABC) from 2003-2008 and was a Booster Club member from 1988-1993 and 1998-2008. Under Moore's leadership, the Booster Club supported the building of an athletic field house, outdoor fields and tracks, and provided upgrades to the weight room. Moore has helped support the Bulldogs in every way possible by spending time working in the concession stands, working food tents, and spotting at high school football games.

Coach Moore has shown unparalleled support for Cedarburg athletic programs and has been an inspiration to those who have gone through CHS athletics. Moore has touched so many lives and framed so many memories through his "Always do the right thing" speeches. His commitment has provided a great service to the Cedarburg community.

BRIAN SCHEUNEMANN

Athlete, Class of 1970



Scheunemann attended Cedarburg High School from 1966-1970 and was a standout athlete on the hardwood, participating in three sports. In basketball, he was an outstanding player, accumulating honors such as team MVP, All-Conference selection and Third Team All-State during his playing career. Scheunemann averaged 21.0 points per game and 15.6 rebounds per game. He posted a career high 41 points in a game, which was a school record for 40 years.

Scheunemann lettered four times in track and field and was a State Qualifier in the 220-yard dash in 1968. He also played football his junior and senior year, lettering twice playing End and Defensive Back.

After graduating Cedarburg, he was a star center at Carthage College. Scheunemann played varsity for three years scoring 1,330 points and was All-CCIW team for three years. Other college accomplishments include NAIA District 14 Team, All-Wisconsin Independent College Association Team and All-Crusader Classic Tournament Team.

CORI THIERMANN

Athlete, Class of 2001

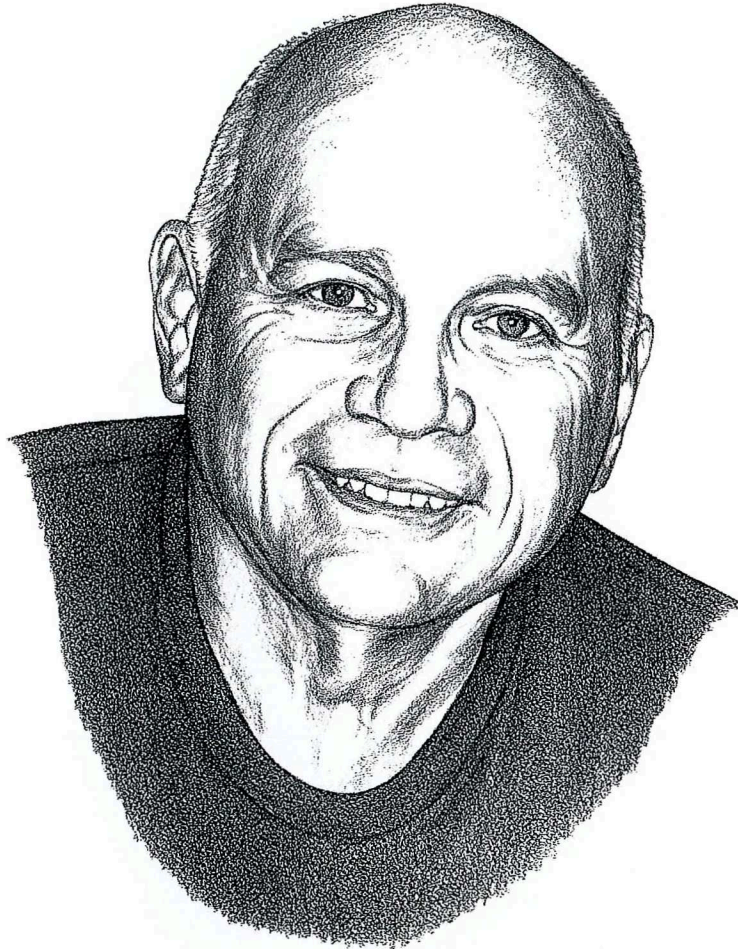


Cori Thiermann attended Cedarburg High School from 1997-2001. Thiermann was an outstanding softball player, starting all four years and being named to the All-State Team as a senior and the All-Conference Team all four years. Thiermann helped lead her team to the North Shore title and took her team to the State Tournament twice. She compiled a 76-15 record over her four years and was part of a State-ranked team her last three seasons. She is also the record holder for most doubles in a career with 19 from the cleanup position and was team Captain her senior year. Thiermann was regarded as an all-around player as she called the game from behind the plate, and opposing players rarely opted to steal on her.

Thiermann earned a Division I scholarship to UW-GB where she played all four years. She was a 4-year Horizon League Honor Roll member, Horizon League Champion and a 4-year All-Conference selection. Thiermann began her coaching career at Berry College in Georgia where she instituted its softball program in 2009. She has accumulated five Conference Coach of the Year awards and was a part of a 17-0 season since the 2009 inaugural season.

ROD WILTERDINK

Coach, 1979-2005



Coach Wilterdink was the Varsity Softball Coach for Cedarburg High School for 26 years. His overall record during his tenure was 363-156. Wilterdink led his teams to nine conference championships and nine State tournament runs. In 2004, he was named area Coach of the Year. The foundation that he built at Cedarburg has helped the program grow to become one of the most respected in Wisconsin.

Wilterdink also coached baseball for 10 years at Cedarburg High School. After leaving the Bulldog Softball Program in 2005, he coached for Concordia University for two years and MSOE for one season. He was also named to the Wisconsin Fastpitch Softball Coaches Association Hall of Fame in 2010.

Coach Wilterdink has made an impact throughout the community. His pursuit of excellence in performance and character extended his value to the school players that go way beyond wins and losses. His analytical mind and game strategy have been highlighted as his greatest attributes. Coach Wilterdink's ability to maintain the integrity of the sport and see the potential in a player is something that has been exhibited year in and year out.
