



Immunization Requirements

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Student Immunization Records

- **Part 1:** Parent/guardians will complete State required student immunization verification online, through the New Student Online Enrollment. This step of the New Student Online Enrollment process is to be completed and on file in your child's school within thirty days after the child starts school.

You should also be aware that the Wisconsin Student Immunization Law requires a completed school vaccine record and is required to keep a record of immunizations received *after* this step in the process. If you need to have your child immunized, please contact your child's physician.

- **Part 2:** Once your child is enrolled, and additional immunizations are completed, please bring those immunization records to the school office to update your child's immunization file.

A complete vaccine record would include the month, day and year following immunizations:

| <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ● 4 doses of DTaP, DTP (diphtheria, tetanus, pertussis/whooping cough) or DT (diphtheria, tetanus) vaccine. ● 3 doses polio vaccine ● 3 doses of Hepatitis B vaccine - at least one dose must be after 6 months old ● 1 dose of MMR (measles, mumps, rubella) vaccine ● 1 dose of Varicella (chickenpox) vaccine or parent report that the child has had chickenpox illness with a date of the disease | <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ● 4 doses of DTaP, DTP (diphtheria, tetanus, pertussis/whooping cough) or DT (diphtheria, tetanus) vaccine. A 5th dose may be needed for children entering kindergarten if one of the DTaP doses was not given after the 4th birthday. ● 4 doses polio vaccine ● 3 doses of Hepatitis B vaccine - at least one dose must be after 6 months old ● 2 doses of MMR (measles, mumps, rubella) vaccine ● 2 doses of Varicella (chickenpox) vaccine or parent report that the child has had chickenpox illness with a date of the disease |

Waivers are available for religious, health and personal conviction reasons. However, if an outbreak of a vaccine-preventable disease occurs, students with waivers may be excluded from school until the outbreak ends.
